Virtue Sheet:

Honesty – To always tell the truth, no matter what!

Concrete examples – Remember that you want your son to select only one of these each week so he can work on building up the virtue of honesty in a very focused, concrete way, and he can see some real progress along the way. Each boy is different so the means you choose with him should be appropriate to him, his age, maturity, personality, etc.

Honesty with God:

Make a commitment to Jesus to do my morning prayers first thing every day, and be honest by fulfilling that commitment.

Make a commitment to Jesus to do my night prayers first thing every day, and be honest by fulfilling that commitment.

Be honest with God by being still and quiet during the Holy Mass.

Be honest with God by paying attention, praying and responding throughout the Mass. (The former may be appropriate for a 5 year old, this one perhaps for a 7 or 8 year old.)

Spend a few minutes each day examining my conscience and make a good, truthful confession this week.

Honesty with Parents:

When my parents ask me to do a chore, I will be honest in my actions by doing what they ask.

When my parents talk to me about my day, I will be honest by making an effort to tell them about all that happened, whether good or bad.

Honesty at School:

I will be truthful in my actions to my teacher by not speaking when she asks me not to.

I will be truthful by giving my best effort in _____ (math, reading, history, etc.).

At recess I will be truthful with my actions by allowing everyone to participate in our games.

Honesty with Siblings:

If I have an argument with my siblings, I will be honest with my parents about what happened, even if it means I will get into trouble.

I will let my siblings have a fair turn with games/toys.
